The situation can be summarized as follows: After suffering a significant defeat on October 7, Israel was left in a state of shock. The Gaza Division collapsed, and within hours, Israel's morale plummeted. In a desperate search for a quick victory, Israel retaliated against the civilian population in Gaza through systematic destruction, implementing a scorched-earth policy and attempting forced displacement. Despite these efforts, Israel failed militarily and is now seeking to compensate by targeting civilians, children, mosques, and hospitals, even going so far as to evacuate 22 healthcare facilities. On the military front, Israel appears confused, while the resistance remains confident. The resistance leadership has thoroughly studied all potential air, sea, and land scenarios, dismissing Israel's posturing as mere intimidation. In this context, Israel appears to be a paper tiger, lacking substance and effectiveness. Consider this scenario: A surge of Western involvement in Israel, with the German Chancellor serving as the US Foreign Minister and Defense Minister, and the potential arrival of President Biden. It highlights Israel's image as a regional powerhouse, purportedly instilling fear and serving Western interests in the region. In contrast, Gaza's resistance, led by the Al-Qassam Brigades and their Chief of Staff, Abu Khaled Muhammad Al-Dhaif, commands global attention. This calls for American support, as recently reported by The Wall Street Journal, which mentioned the deployment of two thousand soldiers, ostensibly for expertise, akin to their actions in Ukraine and Israel.

Go back to the last archive. This is not the first war in 2008 and 2012. In 2014, 2021, and now in this latest conflict, the same slogan resurfaces: 'We want to destroy Hamas.' Western support remains consistent. Let me remind you of 1996 when Israel assassinated the hero Yahya Ayyash. Forty days later, the Palestinian resistance and the Al-Qassam Brigades responded with four major operations that shook Israel. Then-American President Clinton convened an international conference, possibly in Taba. Clinton also visited Israel, riding buses to reassure the Israeli public despite the martyrdom operations. This illustrates that Israel, often seen as a regional original, is an exception supported by American and Western military, security, and economic aid. In essence, it's a settlement project, as Abdul Wahab Al-Mesiri

suggested, and history shows that all such projects eventually dismantle, whether long or short-lived.

I firmly believe, my dear brother, that the Al-Aqsa flood has rattled the very foundations of the Zionist entity like never before. This is our moment as Palestinians, Arabs, Muslims, and freedom-loving people worldwide to stand against occupation, settlements, and aggression. Our mission is clear: to prepare until this occupation is no more. Our core issue is occupation, and our objectives include reclaiming and safeguarding our land, Jerusalem, and Al-Aqsa, liberating our prisoners, ending the Gaza blockade, and living in freedom. Today, Gaza, Jerusalem, the West Bank, the '48 territories, and the diaspora aren't seeking mere concessions. Our demand is grand: freedom, liberation, and an end to occupation. It's time for the path of jihad and resistance, not worn-out settlement projects. The world, including America, recognizes that Israel has buried the two-state solution. Our only horizon now is resistance.

No one is talking about a ceasefire. On the contrary, Israel is beating the drums of war. America supports it. I mean, imagine Biden saying, I mean, I do not hold or support Israel to rule and reoccupy the Gaza Strip, but it must invade the Gaza Strip and eliminate Hamas. God willing, this is great wisdom. They stood worried about the invasion and worried about what comes after the invasion. This was not the first time Israel had done this. And every time Israel emerges defeated and the resistance emerges victorious. And imagine. I am addressing the Arab, Islamic and international street. In the past there were wars between armies and between countries. Sometimes we defeat the Zionist entity in the seventy-three years, and they were defeated before that. Unfortunately, today these wars are being fought on the land of Palestine and in a limited but huge area of Gaza. This is evidence of the decline of the Zionist entity because it is illegal, and therefore today there is no real talk about a ceasefire.

Rather, they are discussing how to open the Rafah crossing. Should we halt the firing for a few hours to allow civilians or foreigners in the Gaza Strip to leave? Egypt has insisted on this, and America announced its agreement. However, Netanyahu's office subsequently denied it, calling it a lie. Israel is gearing up for war. Where is this conflict heading? They are anxious and making preparations, while we remain confident and prepared to face it. I can tell you that if they had engaged us on October 7th and attempted a ground advance in Gaza, we would have defeated them, God willing.

Where does communication stand? I mean, regarding the prisoners. If we captured prisoners on October 7th, there were prisoners held before that. We have around six thousand male and female prisoners, including children, the elderly, elderly patients, and those who have spent up to forty-five years in Israeli prisons. So, one of the motivations and objectives of this battle was to capture Israeli prisoners among their soldiers and officers. This way, we can showcase the Zionist prisons among our people. But Mr. Khaled, there are dual nationals among them, including Americans, and this is noteworthy.

I will address this, Brother Ahmed. Yes, there are daily predictions by Israel regarding the numbers, and these numbers continue to rise. The resistance has gathered sufficient information to potentially use in negotiations for the release of our prisoners in Israeli custody. Concerning civilians and individuals of other nationalities, this matter has been raised by certain countries and mediators. The leadership of our movement has decided to handle this issue responsibly. There is a distinction between military personnel and the Zionist soldiers we captured during the battle.

These are prisoners of war that we took from the battlefield, and among them are high-ranking officers. Mainly from the Gaza Division, there is no doubt that there are civilians of other nationalities who were present on the battlefield. During those hours, with the collapse of the Gaza Division, some of our people from the Gaza Strip and other factions entered. Thus, there is a number that the resistance leadership is still trying to gather. However, due to the intense bombing, we have not yet reached a count of all of them. In short, the military personnel have their accounts, while civilians and individuals of other nationalities have their own accounts. The Hamas leadership will deal in accordance with international humanitarian law and its values and morals. You know that Brother Abu Khaled Al-Deif, at the beginning of the Al-Aqsa Flood Battle, addressed the Al-Qassam youth and the elite forces with the commandments of the Prophet, may God bless him and grant him peace, regarding our values and morals.

And in accordance with the instructions of Islam: Do not kill children, the elderly, or women. This is what we adhere to. As for civilian casualties, it's an unfortunate aspect of wars. The key difference between us and the Israelis is their deliberate targeting of children and civilians, as they are doing now. They are destroying towers and houses without warning, while our focus is on engaging the heavily armed Israeli soldiers. Our intention is not to harm civilians, even though the Zionist entity is a heavily militarized society. You're aware that there are approximately three hundred and seventy thousand reserve soldiers who have been mobilized, engaging in civil service within Israeli society. They are called up during times of war, and you've witnessed what has happened in recent days.

This is an issue that is being dealt with politically by the leadership of the movement with the parties concerned, and we do not talk about it in the media because that spoils it. We are concerned with achieving the interest and for Hamas to act as it does with unparalleled courage on the ground. It and all the Palestinian resistance brigades also act with an intelligent mind, a political mind, and moral logic in dealing. With all of this, with this issue with all its different segments, I believe that the countries and parties that we reviewed and spoke with every day realize Hamas' moral and political responsibility in this.

Look, my dear brother Ahmed, today there are many aspects to theater. The first aspect is the military battle. This was fought by Hamas with manliness, honor, chivalry, and nobility. Israel is threatening, please, and they have ground forces that have mobilized almost all of their tanks and are attacking them. Please enter if you are men, if you are serious and not afraid of confrontation. So this is the military aspect of theater or battle. The second aspect is the destruction, systematic killing, attempted displacement, and the scorched earth policy that Israel is doing. This requires the international community to attack and not be led into the false narrative. I mean, the

story that Netanyahu told. Even the Americans discovered that they were deceived.

I mean, they believed the lie. This is not the first time Netanyahu has lied. Today, the international community and their demands require an Arab and Islamic diplomatic and political movement, along with support from our friends worldwide. We are grateful to all the countries that have taken steps to condemn Israeli massacres and curb this aggression.

The third issue is providing relief for our people. Currently, there are about four hundred thousand to five hundred thousand displaced people inside the Gaza Strip who refuse to leave their land. In fact, when people whose homes were bombed sought refuge in areas within Gaza, Israel pursued them.

Rather, as you saw, I think two days ago, they bombed the large cars in which there were about seventy martyrs. There is no safety inside Gaza, and yet our people are rooted in the homeland, these people who are sheltered in schools and headquarters.

UNRWA, international institutions, Arab and Islamic countries, and the international community are required to open the Rafah crossing, cooperate with the Egyptian leadership, and allow aid from all countries to enter. This is a humanitarian matter. Netanyahu is committing war crimes as he does so. Do you know, my brother Ahmed, why he does this? I think Netanyahu is not far from his mind what happened on the first crossing of October 6, seventy-three, when Golda Meir was in the Labor Party. After the battle and defeat, Golda Meir paid the bill and the price, and the era of the Labor Party went away and returned turbulently after that, but the Likud came under leadership.

If you please, brother Ahmed, go ahead, brother Ahmed, but complete this sentence. Today, Netanyahu is the one who fears trial and is trying to change the judicial system. Thank God, Netanyahu has become one of the group of corrupt rulers, sacrificing his entity for the sake of his and his wife's personal interests. Today, what is Netanyahu doing? He wants to expand the circle of

this aggression and this violence in the region by killing civilians to create an image of victory so that neither he personally nor the political bloc that he represents will pay the due. Therefore, in front of this theater, the Arab and Islamic countries, our friends in the world, are required to change the current scene if they want to return to anyone. Israel is returning to military conflict. We are ready for it, but we must neutralize these crimes committed against our people in the Gaza Strip.

First, consider Palestinian steadfastness based on memory and experience. We've learned from the seventy-five years of conflict, dating back to the days of the entity and even before during the British Mandate, that Palestinians will not leave their land. Throughout past wars, more people have entered Gaza than left. This is the first point. Second, today our people rely on a powerful resistance. People witness elite forces like the Al-Qassam Brigades and Al-Quds Brigades. All military aspects defeat Israel, often within hours, and then they attempt to expose the vulnerabilities of the resistance. However, the resistance relies on a strong foundation, supported by divine guidance. This is the second point.

Third, every day moves forward. The morale of our people is increasing. Resistance is harder. Israel exposes its nakedness. Its lies to the international community are the first shock that made it join forces with Israel and involve it. His lies today see the Israeli crime and with the truth the good Arab politics today. Blinken visited the region. What did he find? He found one Arab position. Condemning the Israeli crime. They refused to condemn Hamas and the resistance and rejected the idea of displacement. He thanks the Arabs for these positions. But we want more. All this situation is good and I am telling you this displacement is not an excuse. Rejecting displacement is a Palestinian decision and a popular decision, not just a factional decision.

Refusing displacement is not only a Palestinian interest; it is also an Egyptian interest. Imagine if the people of Gaza were forcibly displaced, but they refuse to leave. They will not allow it. This would harm Egyptian national security and create chaos within Egypt. If such a scenario were to unfold, it

could result in many casualties. The same goes for their plan to displace people in the West Bank, as they did in Huwwara by burning and storming towns. They have used this strategy in the past against Jordan because they consider Jordan as part of their state. This poses a danger to Jordan as well. Therefore, it is in the interest of Arab countries to support the Palestinian right, as the Palestinian issue is intertwined with their own and is also a matter of Arab national interest.

Yes, there is preoccupation in southern Lebanon. Hezbollah, I mean, practiced this preoccupation, thankfully, and this is good. Also, Palestinian forces such as Jihad and Hamas from southern Lebanon practiced this, and this is a Palestinian right. This is the right of the resistance. We do not interfere in the affairs of states, but we are a displaced people living in camps. The enemy is killing us. Our people are being killed. We are one people and one cause, the son of Gaza, the son of Jerusalem, the West Bank, the Forty-Eight, and the son of the Palestinian diaspora. We are one people, one cause, and our blood is one.

The battle today, my brother Ahmed, is centered around Al-Aqsa. The people of Gaza and the resistance there have played a significant role in defending Al-Aqsa. Israel has a plan, led by individuals like Ben Smotrich and Netanyahu, to destroy Al-Aqsa and construct a so-called temple in its place. They have initiated rituals related to animal sacrifices, as outlined in the Talmud. This plan extends beyond the West Bank, where resistance emerged a year ago to protect Al-Aqsa. Despite our efforts, the scale of the conspiracy is immense, with the entire Zionist entity united in pursuing this agenda.

The Al-Qassam Brigades made a decisive move on October 7th, emphasizing that Al-Aqsa must be liberated to protect it. Today, the central focus remains on Al-Aqsa. We also stand in solidarity with Gaza, which contributed significantly to the cause of Al-Aqsa. However, our overarching goal is to end the occupation and achieve freedom, free our imprisoned compatriots, lift the Gaza blockade, and remove the settlers. Given these significant objectives, everyone's involvement is essential. Hezbollah has taken positive

steps, and I commend their efforts. But we must ask for more because our mission is of utmost importance.

My dear brother Ahmed, I appreciate the considerations related to regional warfare, but let's approach this logically. Our central issue is Palestine, and it holds immense significance for all of us. Israel poses a threat to everyone. In the past, Israel's military strategy included potential fronts with Egypt, Syria, or Jordan. Today, these official fronts are limited to Gaza, the West Bank, the Forty-Eight areas, South Lebanon, Syria, Lebanon, and Iran. These fronts have strategic importance. Our utmost priority, guided by our principles and responsibility towards Jerusalem, Al-Aqsa, and Palestine, is to unite and fight this battle together.

Hence, the current situation is acceptable, but insufficient. Allow me to emphasize, my dear brother Ahmed, that what we see unfolding under the banner of the Al-Aqsa flood initiated by the Al-Qassam Brigades on October 7th is just the beginning. We require more than a flood; this is a historic opportunity. Brothers, my dear Ahmed, history is not shaped by playing it safe or taking timid steps. It's forged through daring, well-planned adventures that demonstrate mastery, genius, and creativity, all by the grace of God Almighty.
